Conference Openers (for early readers)

If student is just starting a book:

- Tell me how you chose this book.
- Have you read any other books before?
- Show me what you did when you first started reading this book (or what you will do in order to get started reading).
- How do you know this is a "just right" book for you?
- What kinds of books, topics do you like to read?
- Let's take a look at what you've been reading for the last few weeks.

What does the student know about herself as a reader?

If student is in the middle of a book:

- Would you read a little bit of the story to me?
 (Do a quick running record and record strategy use, word attack.)
- What's happening in the story so far? What are you noticing?
- Tell me about the characters... feelings... actions...
- What do you do when you get stuck on a word?
- Can you take me to a place...?
- Was there a part that was confusing? How did you handle that?
- What are you thinking about as you read?

Is the student actively engaged in purposeful reading? Is the student monitoring for meaning and using a variety of strategies?

Is the student thinking beyond the text?

If student has just finished a book:

- What do you think?
- Would you recommend this book to another reader?
- What did you learn about yourself as a reader?
- Can you retell or summarize what happened in the story?
- What strategies did you use that helped you?
- What do you plan to do next?

While conferring, it is critical that teachers model and share from their

own experience as readers.
